This thesis entitled 'Borders And Multiplication Of Labour In Late Capitalism: A Study Of Girmit And Kafala Migration From Bihar'; engages with migration from two districts of the North Indian state of Bihar-Buxar and Bhojpur to the GCC nations under the Kafala system of migration. It emphasises the complex role of borders in delineating the boundary between state sovereignty and the more fluid operations of global capital regimes. The multiplication of labour emphasizes the intensification and fragmentation of global labour processes, particularly within neoliberal contexts defined by precarity, technological advances, and transnational connectivity.
