About the Symposium

As part of the SPARC Project (P2485) jointly undertaken by the Department of Humanistic Studies, IIT (BHU), Varanasi and the School of Religion and Theology, Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam, this international symposium brings together scholars, practitioners, and students to explore intersections of Spiritual Care, Indian Knowledge Systems, Hindu Worldviews, and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in a world shaped simultaneously by VUCA (Volatility, Uncertainty, Complexity, Ambiguity) and BANI (Brittle, Anxious, Non-linear, Incomprehensible) conditions.

Anchored in the pluralistic and integrative spirit of Hindu worldviews, the symposium explores how indigenous philosophies can foster sustainability and collective well-being amid global uncertainty. Focusing on SDG 2 (Zero Hunger), SDG 3 (Good Health & Well-being), and SDG 5 (Gender Equality), it re-envision spiritual care through ancient wisdom and modern aspirations.

- **Indian Knowledge Systems, Hindu Worldview and Development:** Concept of Dharma, Karma, Yoga, and others in dialogue with sustainability, rituals and traditional practices, oral and folk literature.
- **Literary perspectives and practices in Spiritual Care:** Practices of resilience, care, and sustainability; role of faith-based and interfaith initiatives.
- **VUCA-BANI Coping Mechanisms:** Community and diaspora strategies for navigating disruptions, uncertainty, and complexity.
- **Cross-Cultural and Interdisciplinary Approaches:** Culinary practices, customs for health care, education, ecological ethics, security and inter-religious harmony.
